



Dear Friends of A Precious Child,

A Precious Child continued to work steadfast in 2015 to make a positive impact in the lives of disadvantaged and displaced children and families in Colorado. Propelled by the fact that a staggering 180,000 Colorado children are living in poverty and as a result are more likely to be in poor health, are less likely to graduate from high school on time and are more likely to live in poverty as adults.

Thanks to the contributions and hard work of countless caring individuals, we were able to distribute more than \$4.6 million worth of essentials, resources and opportunities. We accomplished this through our partnership with 261 Agency Partners, who refer children and families in the most need to us, and through the support of 3,503 volunteers who donated over 20,000 hours. This of course would not have been possible without the generous donations and investments made by thousands of donors and grantors who believe in the work we are doing. We served 33,588 children and 2,628 adults in 2015. These numbers are outstanding, and we celebrate the success we had especially since we know that behind every number there is a child in need.

Always looking at how we can better serve children and their families, in 2015 A Precious Child set its focus on diving deeper into outcomes based service delivery. We know how life-changing basic essentials can be for children who are facing difficult challenges such as homelessness, abuse and poverty. It's undeniable that having appropriate clothing, toiletries, school supplies and even a chance to participate in sports can make all the difference in their ability to be successful in school. We set out this past year to put into place the infrastructure to not only measure and demonstrate the positive impact we have, but to assess and identify how our programs can have even greater impact moving forward.

As a result, several of our programs underwent enhancements that are intended to provide long-term benefits to children and families. Take for instance our Basics 4 Babies Program, which provides direct aid to mothers and families who might otherwise ration or go without basic necessities such as diapers, baby food, baby gear, and formula for their babies. After assessing how we might help change the life trajectory of a baby who is born into poverty, we partnered with Bright by Three to provide educational parenting and learning toolkits to moms and caregivers when they come into our Resource Center.

In assessing the gaps that exist in opportunities for children, we also clearly saw the need to step in further to help remove barriers to a child's educational success. So this past year we launched our new Edussentials Program, which provides educational opportunities and resources through scholarships to remove barriers for school attendance and improve educational outcomes.

A Precious Child's growth and accomplishments are dependent on the amount of support we receive from our community, and the many outstanding businesses and corporations who rally behind us. As a result, 2015 was an 'epic' one for A Precious Child, literally! Our friends at Level 3 Communications selected A Precious Child as their charity partner for the 2015 Vail Resorts Epic Ski Challenge. After three months of fierce competition with nine other teams in Colorado, and 10 teams in Utah, Team Level 3 came in first place, and received a \$100,000 donation from Vail Resorts for A Precious Child.

These are just a few highlights from this past year and we cannot thank our supporters, volunteers and partners enough for helping to make everything we accomplished possible. With your continued support we are looking forward to having an even greater impact in the lives of disadvantaged and displaced children for years to come.

Provides clothing, coats, shoes, toiletries, home goods and other basic essentials to disadvantaged and displaced children and families in Colorado. Precious Essentials served over 9,719 individuals with a value of over \$2,031,078 of essentials in 2015.



Satellite resource centers that are located in schools, community centers and shelters, dedicated to providing basic essentials on-site to children in need. Precious Boutiques served 682 children with a value of over \$45,010 of essentials in 2015.



Provides direct aid to mothers and families who might otherwise ration or go without basic necessities such as diapers, baby gear, baby food, and formula for their babies. Basics 4 Babies served over 1,565 individuals with a value of over \$237,552 of essentials in 2015.



Provides basic essentials such as clothing, toiletries, blankets and other personal essentials to children and families in crisis to help them to recover from natural disasters or crisis situations.





Ensures that every child who comes to the Resource Center is provided with a space that encourages STEM based learning. The Learning Center served 735 children in 2015.



Provides educational opportunities and resources through scholarships to remove barriers for school attendance and improve educational outcomes.



Provides incentives to students who have improved attendance in school as an early intervention initiative and a way to combat truancy. Truancy Intervention served 301 children in courts across the Denver Metro Area in 2015.



Provides backpacks filled with grade-appropriate school supplies to maximize academic potential for disadvantaged and displaced children. Fill A Backpack distributed 8,474 backpacks to children in need with a value of over \$423,600 of supplies in 2015.





Provides gifts to children who would otherwise go without during monumental times in their lives such as birthdays and during holiday seasons. Precious Gift served 7,412 children with holiday gifts and 367 children with birthday bags with a value of over \$388,950 in 2015.



Provides new and gently-used sports equipment and participation fee scholarships so all children have the opportunity to participate in sports. The giveSPORTS Program served 4,333 children with a value of \$221,500 in 2015.




In addition, 3,481 children and adults were served *indirectly* by A Precious Child through agency partners in 2015.






REVENUES & SUPPORT




