A LETTER FROM OUR CEO

As we reflect on 2022, my heart is filled with a profound sense of pride and deep gratitude. Since 2008, our journey has always been driven by a steadfast commitment to empower and uplift children and families in need. This past year, marked by unique challenges, has been a testament to the strength and resilience inherent in our community.

The Marshall Fire, a devastating event that struck at the heart of our community, called for an immediate and compassionate response. In these trying moments, the true spirit of A Precious Child shone through. We leaped into action, providing over \$3.76 million in resources to the affected families. The urgency and scale of our response were a reflection of our team's deep empathy and unwavering resolve to stand with those in their darkest hours. It is during such times that our mission transcends beyond aid—it becomes a beacon of hope and solidarity.

Throughout 2022, we reached remarkable heights in our service. Our Precious Gift and Fill A Backpack programs achieved record-breaking impact, serving 17,215 and 21,911 children, respectively. We distributed over a million diapers, signifying our rapid adaptation to the growing needs of the community. Our 300% increase in bulk distributions was a crucial step in ensuring that essentials reached families efficiently.

Our commitment to environmental stewardship remained an unwavering priority, as we creatively repurposed and reused donations, significantly reducing our ecological footprint. Just this year, we diverted 16,763,138 gallons of clean water and prevented 8,197,611 pounds of greenhouse gases by reusing textiles and other goods made with plastics and paper. This speaks to both our responsibility toward the planet and our dedication to serving this wonderful community.

Diversity, equity, inclusion, belonging and access were the cornerstones of our initiatives. Achieving 50% female representation on our board and serving a diverse client population, we ensured that every individual we touched felt seen, heard and valued. These efforts are a reflection of our belief in the power of inclusivity.

The incredible support from our volunteers, staff, boards, partners and the broader community has been the driving force behind our achievements. Your dedication, time and resources have been instrumental in bringing our vision to life. The hours you have invested in our cause have not only propelled us forward, but have also instilled a sense of hope and possibility in the lives we touch.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS



A Precious Child played a crucial role in supporting families impacted by the Marshall Fire, immediately providing blankets and pillows on the night of the fire and, subsequently, offering a wide range of goods and resources at no cost. The organization engaged in extensive community partnerships, organized various events and distributed resources totaling **\$3.76 million**, showcasing a dedicated and comprehensive effort to address the diverse needs of the affected families.



A Precious Child's Precious Gift and Fill A Backpack programs both had a **record-breaking** year. Precious Gift served **17,215 children** and Fill A Backpack served **21,911 children**.



A Precious Child distributed over a million diapers to our community – nearly **five times** what we distributed in 2021.



A Precious Child ramped up our bulk distributions by **300%**. This effort enabled us to get basic essentials into the hands of families quickly.

“My name is Shanda, and after losing my daughter, Jenelle, I am now raising my three beautiful grandchildren: Julia, Josiah and Jason.

I started coming to A Precious Child in September of 2020. I was living in a two-bedroom condo and needed everything. I had to upsize again because of the grandkids. A Precious Child has been instrumental, helping me furnish our home, providing beds, bedding, clothes and dressers.

They check in on how you feel, how you're doing, how's the family — it's like being accepted into a family. I knew that I was coming to get things for the kids, like clothes and shoes, but I also received love and acceptance.

I have to be the strong one. Who takes care of the one that takes care of everybody? That's what I've gotten from A Precious Child.

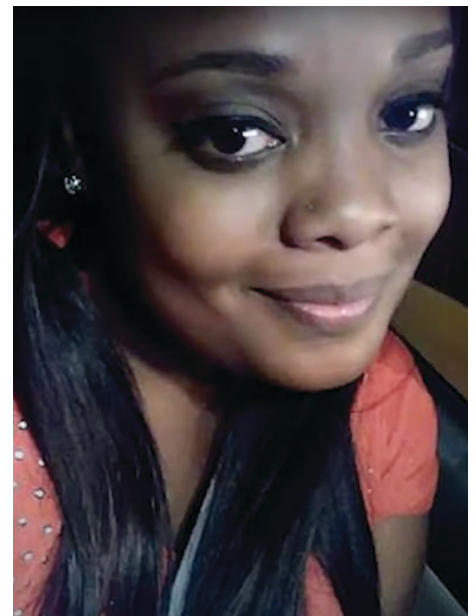
I've been on disability, on a fixed income. The only way to get my granddaughter Julia to school was to call an Uber. A Precious Child offered solutions. They helped with Uber rides for her to get to school. They cared enough about my six-year-old.

It's an amazing feeling, after going through so much, to have somebody help you carry the cross. You guys act like they're your kids. That's how genuine it is.

It's been two years, and now I know that I can take care of business like I need to. Because of A Precious Child, I was able to get a car for my family.

I'm not going to be any less of a parent to them than I was to my daughter. They deserve it. Working with the people at A Precious Child has helped me get my faith back in people and humanity. There are still some good, genuine, loving people out there.

There is no way that her death is going to be in vain. I will do everything to make sure that if she can see us, she's smiling, happy and proud of her mama, and that she can rest well knowing that they're okay.”

At A Precious Child, we believe in making a lasting difference in the lives of children and families in need. Meet Zachary, Gabriel and their father—a loving family who found hope, support and a sense of belonging through our organization.

“Normally we feel uncomfortable when we go to a new place, but A Precious Child is different,” says Zachary.

“We just felt like we were at home when we came here. It’s amazing. It feels good,” responds Gabriel, brother to Zachary. He continues, “I really feel like this company did a lot of stuff for our family, and I’m really grateful. I don’t know where we would be because when my dad wasn’t employed, we really needed stuff from A Precious Child, and it really helped us. It’s so amazing because, like, you can go here and you just find the exact thing you want.”

Their father says, “I think for us, needing help was really when we got into a mortgage. Honestly, it was kind of too much for us. And then our family size kept growing. Then there was, because of the pandemic, the loss of a job. So then I found myself needing a loan on my vehicle, I’ve got a mortgage, and we’re this large family and now I don’t have anything coming in.”

He continues, “I have six kids. I don’t want them to feel out of sorts because of people not understanding our situation. The one thing that my wife and I both try to do is humble ourselves to know that, you know, it’s okay to ask for help, that it’s okay to know that there’s resources. Three of my kids went to the giveSPORTS camps over the summer. That was the highlight of the summer.”

Zachary shares his excitement. “So amazing. I mean, we got to meet Dalton Risner and Justin Simmons,

and we got to play football. It was so amazing. That was definitely one of the best experiences, like, ever.”

“It feels so heartwarming that someone actually just steps out of their way. It just becomes a whole new level of kindness,” says Gabriel.

Their father responds, “Without A Precious Child, our family would miss out on great activities for our children that we could otherwise not provide and that are literally memories that they’ll have with them for the rest of their lives.”





ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

- With our Donation Center, we are able to reuse donated gently-used goods and provide, with dignity, much-needed essentials for our families.
- A Precious Child received over 60,000 pounds of donations per month through our Donation Center with 85% of the donations received being recycled or reused. We have extended the lifecycle of the most basic items that are needed for the families we serve, without the impact of energy, water or the process of production.
- Plastics, textiles and electronics that do not meet our quality standards are recycled or redirected to programs like Colorado Car Seat Recycling, Cyclo, Denver PC Recycle, Eco-Cycle and GLF.
- In addition, A Precious Child partnered with different vendors and actively receives overstock and discontinued items that were not sold. This collaboration allows us to provide a dignified experience to our families by providing single-use items and extending the lifespan of products that are only in their initial life phase – preventing additional waste in landfills.
- In 2022, thanks to our Donation Center and Resource Center, we have diverted 9,197,881 gallons of clean water by reusing textiles. We diverted 7,565,257 gallons of water by reusing other items made with plastic and paper. We prevented 8,197,611 pounds of greenhouse gases by reusing textiles and other goods made with plastics and paper.

SOCIAL IMPACT

IN 2022, A PRECIOUS CHILD:

- Provided immediate and continuous support to the families impacted by one of the most destructive fires in our community: the Marshall Fire.
We served a total of 3,381 individuals with over \$3.76 million in resources.
- Our Resource Center and Empowerment Center worked closely with Lutheran Family Services and the African Community Center to help serve Afghani refugees who were part of a historical evacuation of Afghani families from Kabul to Colorado. We also aided other refugees from other countries that were new to our communities.
We provided our services to 2,107 individuals that arrived in Colorado with little to no essentials.
- While increasing our capacity for emergency services, A Precious Child continues serving families facing difficult life challenges such as abuse, neglect, crisis situations and poverty. In 2022, we served 67,622 individuals with basic essentials.
- In 2022, A Precious Child worked with 7,358 volunteers with over 42,900 hours of service. Our volunteers have a tremendous impact on our programs and our capacity to be prepared when our community needs us the most.

DIVERSITY

At A Precious Child, we define diversity as actively involving people who bring unique perspectives; we believe this is more than just different races or ethnic backgrounds, but also embracing every person and their individual characteristics and voice. Our actions around diversity include:

- Achieving 50% female representation on our board.
- Hiring diverse staff through promoting job openings to clients, and/or requiring our case management staff to speak at least one language in addition to English.
- Serving a diverse client population; 78% of our clients are people of color, and 8% have someone in their family who identifies as LGBTQ+.



EQUITY

At A Precious Child, the push for equity involves first understanding that not everyone starts from the same place and then making adjustments to aid those imbalances for the greater good. Our organization's mission is to empower equal opportunity. We seek to understand the unique personalities, needs and strengths of our clients and staff so we can provide them with differentiated support to help them succeed. Some of our work towards equity includes:

- Our Precious Essentials program supports children and families by providing them with clothing, food, home goods, toiletries and other essentials to ease the struggles of poverty and other emergency situations.
- Our Satellite Resource Centers that are located throughout the Denver Metro Area ensure children and families have access to essentials regardless of transportation and physical limitations.
- Our partnerships with more than 300 active Agency Partners representing different cultures and backgrounds.
- Our volunteer program allows participants from all walks of life, whether they are young adults with disabilities or children as young as five, to make an impact in their communities.
- Our workplace culture ensures all employees are given equal opportunity to contribute, express themselves authentically and engage in the open, human dialogue that drives innovation.

INCLUSION

At A Precious Child, we strive to ensure everyone feels included, valued and respected as an individual, regardless of their backgrounds. We do this through:

- Our Precious Perks program, which supports 16-24-year-olds through difficult transition periods by providing them with Workforce Development training and other critical life skills.
- Creating relationships with and working alongside more than 300 active Agency Partners to ensure families receive resource navigation and support to meet their immediate and ongoing needs.
- Partnering with the State of Colorado to host drive-up and community-based COVID-19 vaccine clinics at A Precious Child to reach marginalized communities.

MEASURED GROWTH

For over 14 years, A Precious Child has helped provide hundreds of thousands of disadvantaged children with opportunities and resources needed to empower them to achieve their full potential. Working with A Precious Child reduces a family's reliance on public assistance programs over time, representing approximately \$5.6 million in combined diverted public assistance dollars for families receiving WIC, TFAP, SNAP and TANF services over two years.

With Cradle to Career support, A Precious Child can break the cycle of poverty by reducing socioeconomic inequalities. After working with A Precious Child for at least nine months, clients experience stress reduction. This is accounted for by having more day-to-day needs being met (cost of school items, etc.), receiving referrals to other service providers, participating in A Precious Child programs that fit their needs (e.g., Basics 4 Babies for families with infants) and having their children participate in our other supportive programs.

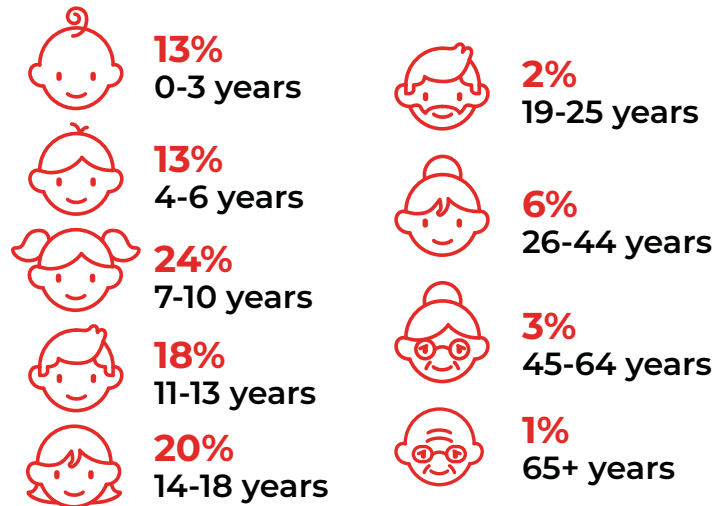

GENDER (ALL PROGRAMS)

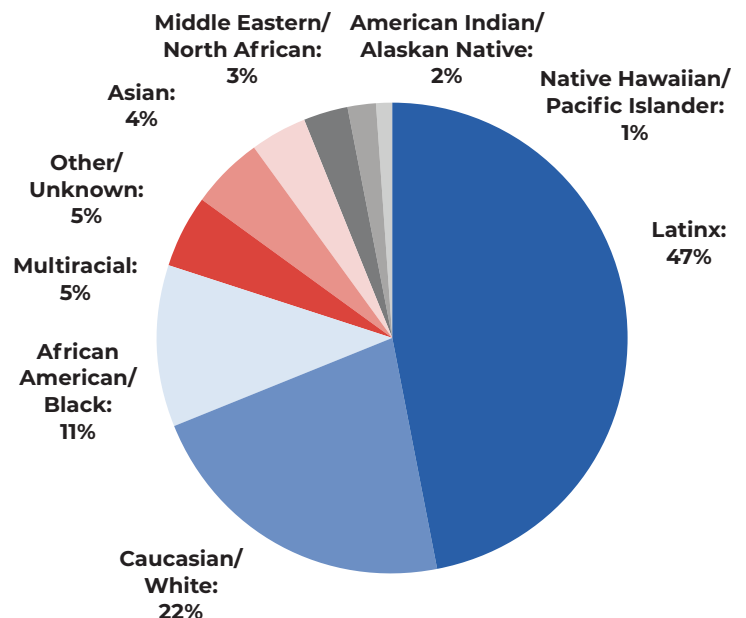

HOW WE DO IT

For almost 15 years, a Precious Child has helped hundreds of thousands of children challenged by poverty, abuse, neglect or crisis situations through our 5 Cradle to Career Initiatives.



CHILD AND FAMILY ADVOCACY

Empowerment Center provides holistic resource navigation and strengths-based case management through wrap-around support and education services to empower children and families on their path to self-sufficiency.



FAMILY STABILITY

Precious Essentials provides basic essentials such as clothing, coats, shoes, food, home goods and hygiene items to families in need to help bridge the income gap so they can spend their limited resources on living expenses.

Basics 4 Babies provides basic essentials such as diapers, wipes, formula and baby gear to families with infants who would otherwise ration or go without these necessities to help them grow up in a healthy environment.



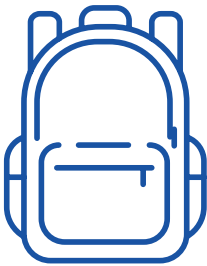
SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING

giveARTS provides support for arts program costs associated with lessons, participation fees, instruments and art supplies to children in need, helping them gain the skills for self-expression, confidence and creativity.

giveSPORTS provides new and gently-used sports equipment and support for sports program costs associated with registration, uniform, camp and participation fees to children in need, giving them the opportunity to participate in activities that help them feel a sense of normalcy alongside their peers.

Precious Mentor provides youth with peer-to-peer, adult-to-youth and workforce development mentorships through an evidence-based curriculum, building positive youth development and enriching academic and professional growth.

Precious Gift provides gifts to children who would otherwise go without during monumental times in their lives, such as birthdays and during the holiday seasons to provide a sense of joy and normalcy during difficult times.

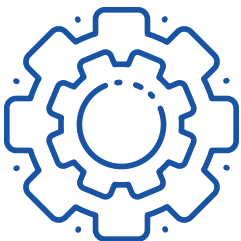


ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Inspiring Minds provides access to STEM-based activities to children visiting A Precious Child's Resource Center and through educational, take-home STEM kits to inspire them to become tomorrow's innovators.

Edussentials provides educational support, such as computers, calculators, tutoring and incentives to remove barriers to school attendance and improve educational outcomes for economically disadvantaged students.

Fill A Backpack provides backpacks filled with grade-appropriate school supplies to children in need to maximize their academic potential.



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Precious Perks Workforce Development provides work-based learning, upskilling and reskilling programming to marginalized young adults ages 15-24 who are currently out of school, without employment or struggling with a learning disorder or behavioral health concern. Participants are able to expand their access to better employment opportunities, create household stability and build overall well-being which leads to economic prosperity.

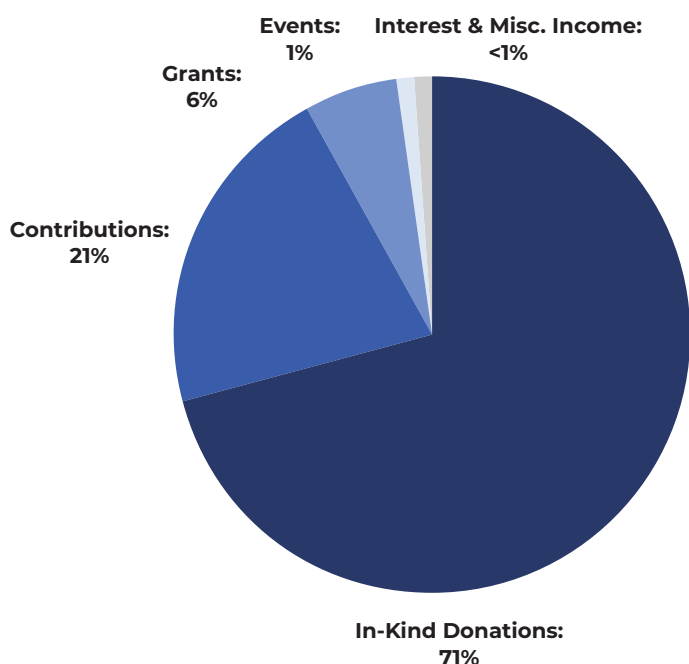

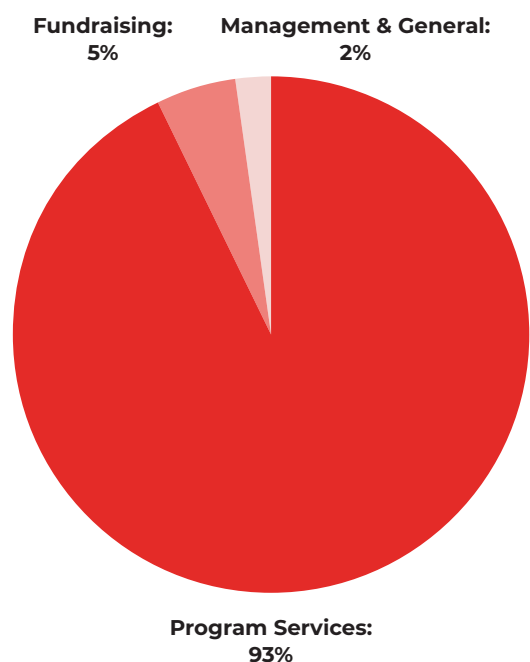

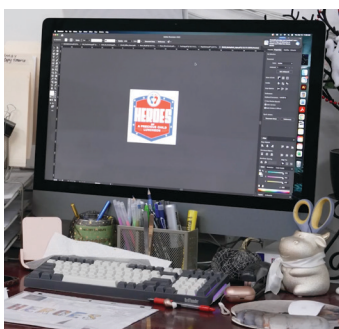
