



OUR PROGRAMS

CHILD & FAMILY ADVOCACY

The **Empowerment Resource Center** offers holistic family services aimed at guiding and supporting children and families as they work towards achieving self-sufficiency. We provide a cost-free store for eligible families stocked with items such as clothing, food, home goods, toys, books, diapers and baby essentials. This allows our clients to allocate their limited resources towards crucial living expenses such as housing, utilities, transportation and healthcare.



FAMILY STABILITY

Basics 4 Babies provides basic essentials such as diapers, wipes, formula and baby gear to families with infants who would otherwise ration or go without these necessities.

Precious Essentials provides basic essentials such as clothing, coats, shoes, food, home goods and hygiene items to families in need to help bridge the income gap so they can spend their limited resources on living expenses.

SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING

giveARTS provides support for arts program costs associated with lessons, participation fees, instruments and art supplies to children in need, helping them gain the skills for self-expression, confidence and creativity.

giveSPORTS provides new and gently-used sports equipment and support for sports program costs associated with registration, uniform, camp and participation fees to children in need, giving them the opportunity to participate in activities that help them feel a sense of normalcy alongside their peers.

Precious Gift provides gifts to children who would otherwise go without during monumental times in their lives, such as birthdays and during the holiday seasons.

Precious Mentor provides youth with peer-to-peer, adult-to-youth and Workforce Development mentorships through an evidence-based curriculum, building positive youth development and enriching academic and professional growth.





ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Edusentials provides educational support, such as computers, calculators, tutoring and incentives to remove barriers to school attendance and improve educational outcomes for economically disadvantaged students.

Fill A Backpack provides backpacks filled with grade-appropriate school supplies to children in need to maximize their academic potential.



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Precious Perks provides opportunities through A Precious Child's Social Enterprise Coffee and Gift Shop for ages 15-24 who are currently out of school, without employment or struggling with a learning disorder, through work-based learning and fostering the skill sets necessary to obtain and retain employment.

“A RECORD BREAKING YEAR”

2,915 Families visited our cost-free Empowerment Resource Center Store to shop for essential items to help them thrive. Between distributions to clients and Agency Partners, 1.4 million diapers were provided to families in need – a record-breaking year.



BEST EMPLOYER NOMINEE

Precious Perks was nominated by both Broomfield and Jefferson Counties as the Best Employer through the Governor’s Summer Job Hunt. A program of the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment, the Governor’s Summer Job Hunt is known as the state’s oldest youth employment program. It connects high school and college-aged students with Colorado employers willing to give them a chance to learn, put skills to use, and see firsthand how a business operates.



WORD OF THANKS WITH KYLE CLARK

A Precious Child was selected as a beneficiary of the Next with Kyle Clark’s Word of Thanks for the third year in a row. “Word of Thanks” is offered every week during the Next with Kyle Clark newscast. It’s a chance to highlight small and medium non-profits doing crucial work in Colorado. Over \$60,000 was raised thanks to these efforts.



ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT



With our Donation Center, we are able to reuse donated gently-used goods and provide, with dignity, much-needed essentials for our families.



A Precious Child received over 67,000 pounds of donations per month through our Donation Center, with 90% of the donations received being reused or recycled. We have extended the lifecycle of the most basic items that are needed for the families we serve without the impact of energy, water or the process of production.



Plastics, textiles and electronics that do not meet our quality standards are recycled or redirected to programs like Colorado Car Seat Recycling, Cycla, Eco-Cycle and GLF.



A Precious Child partners with different vendors and receives overstock and discontinued items that were not sold. These opportunities allow us to provide a dignified experience to our families by providing single-use items and extending the lifespan of products that are only in their initial life phase – preventing additional waste in landfills.



In 2023, thanks to our Donation Center and Empowerment Resource Center, we have diverted 15,968,833 gallons of clean water and prevented 7,729,621 pounds of greenhouse gases.



